#KNOCKOUTHPV: A community-based, interdisciplinary approach to improving HPV vaccine uptake at a large urban public university

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Background

- HPV vaccine: Lowest vaccination rates than other routine adolescent vaccines
 - In 2018, only 51.1% of U.S. males and females aged 13-17 completed the vaccine series
- Barriers: cultural, religious, financial, social, accessibility, etc.
- Current efforts to increase vaccination rates:
 - Technology based interventions
 - School entry requirements for vaccination
 - "Bundling" adolescent vaccines
 - Effective provider communications and recommendations

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Background

- 2006: First HPV vaccine approved
- 2009: HPV vaccine approved for use in boys
- #KnockOutHPV → HPV vaccination promotion targeted at college students:
 - Who have not been vaccinated
 - Have not completed their vaccine series
 - Do not know their vaccination status



Purpose

• Purpose of this project was to pilot a collaborative, interdisciplinary, multifaceted HPV education and vaccination program on the main campus of Wayne State University in Detroit, MI





Specific aims

- Specific Aim #1: Determine the program's financial and logistical feasibility
 - Determine cost-effectiveness of program
- Specific Aim #2:Determine program impact on individual knowledge and attitudes towards HPV and HPV vaccine
 - Event pre/post surveys
- Specific Aim #3: Determine the impact of the program on the local community through measurement of key HPV vaccination metrics
 - Comparison between Jan-Jun 2018 and Jan-Jun 2019

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Promotion and Outreach

- Print material through the Wayne State Graphics department distributed in undergraduate library, student center, dining halls, and other Wayne State buildings
 - February 2019-June 2019
 - Facts studied by Merck to be most effective for college-aged youth
 - Promotional material included a \$10 One card gift card for the first 50 vaccine recipients which they can use at various stores on campus.

Provider Education

- Training program
 - 10 APha-ASP Operation
 Immunization pharmacy students
 - Trained as health navigators on HPV vaccination
 - American Cancer Society training material
 - Provided manual on HPV
 - CDC communication techniques to address barriers





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Access

- Wayne State University Campus Health Center
- Appointments and walk-ins Monday-Friday 9am to 5:30pm
- Vaccination and vaccine status checks using MCIR





Documentation

- Michigan Care Improvement Registry (MCIR)
 - Used by CHC public health student for documentation and record look-up
- CHC Roster
 - Roster of patients seen at clinic who have not completed series
 - Public Health student to contact via phone to encourage vaccine completion

- Determine the program impact on individual knowledge and attitudes towards HPV and the HPV vaccine
- Total surveys: 248
- Females: 160 Males: 88
- Total number who have completed the HPV series: 106

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- Determine the impact of the program on the local community through measurement of key HPV vaccination metrics
- Total number of HPV vaccinations administered during the study period:

- Total number of individuals who started the age-appropriate HPV vaccine series during the study period: 2018 2019
- Total number of individuals who completed the age-appropriate HPV vaccine series during the study period: 2019 2018
- Comparison of total number of HPV vaccinations administered during the study period to the number administered during the same period in the previous year (January 1, 2018 – June 30, 2018): +76.6%







Future direction

- APhA-ASP Operation Immunization \rightarrow Continue HPV information tables on Wayne State University with pharmacy student volunteers
- Strengthen Campus Health Center collaboration with pharmacy students for continued efforts and ideas to improve vaccination rates
- Petition for Wayne State University to add the HPV vaccine to current recommended vaccine list for students living in residence halls
- Continue to integrate pharmacy students in efforts to increase HPV education and vaccination



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
