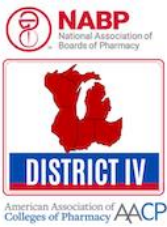

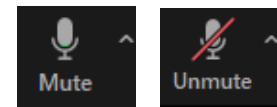
- 1) A general guide and FAQ for Zoom Webinars can be found by [following this link](#).
  - a. *Some of the instructions and features below may or may not be available within the webinar version of Zoom but are included for your information.*
- 2) **How do I join the meeting or session(s)?**
  - a. Simply click on the provided link located above within the agenda (**Zoom Link #**) and enter the passcode provided for each session (if prompted for passcode).
  - b. Each session will have its own unique link, so be sure to access the appropriate link depending on the session.
  - c. **It is highly suggested to download the Zoom desktop client or mobile application ahead of the meeting to join.**
- 3) **Overview of the attendee control bar (bottom of screen):**



- a. **Entering/Leaving the meeting:**
  - i. Click on the proper link to enter the Zoom meeting room.
  - ii. Click on the “Leave” button at the bottom right hand corner to exit the session at any time.
- b. **Sound/Video Recommendations**

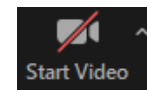
**c. Mute/Unmute**

- i. Mute and unmute your microphone (single click the icon)



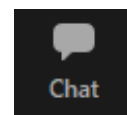
**d. Stop Video/Start Video**

- iii. Chat:



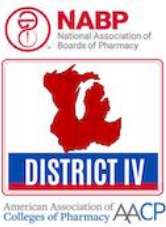
1. Access the chat window (can be used to ask questions to presenters, moderators, and direct message meeting attendees).

## Biography for 2020-2021 NABP President, Timothy D. Fensky



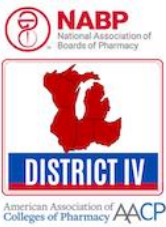
### **President: Timothy D. Fensky, RPh, DPh, FACA**

Mr. Fensky, a member of the Massachusetts Board of Registration in Pharmacy, automatically assumed the office of president at the conclusion of NABP's 116th Annual Meeting. Prior to the election, he served one-year terms as president-elect and treasurer and a two-year term as an Executive Committee member (District 1). As a member of NABP, Mr. Fensky has made many contributions to the NABP District 1 meetings and previously served as president of the Massachusetts Board. Mr. Fensky served on the Task Force on Best Practices for Veterinary Compounding and the Task Force on Pharmacist Prescriptive Authority. He currently represents NABP on the Pharmacy Compounding Advisory Committee to the United States Food and Drug Administration. Mr. Fensky is the pharmacy administrator at Bournemouth Health Systems and the chief pharmacy officer at Sullivan's Health Care. Further, he is recognized as a full fellow for the American College of Apothecaries and is an adjunct faculty member at both the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences and Northeastern University, Bouvé College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences. Mr. Fensky earned his Bachelor of Science degree in pharmacy from Northeastern University, Bouvé College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, and received an honorary Doctor of Pharmacy license from the Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy.

## Biography for AACP Immediate Past-President Todd Sorensen



Dr. Sorensen is Professor and Senior Executive Associate Dean for Strategic Initiatives and Faculty Affairs at the College of Pharmacy, University of Minnesota, and Executive Director for the Alliance for Integrated Medication Management. He is currently serving AACP as its Immediate Past-President. His academic work concentrates on identifying strategies that facilitate clinical practice development and developing change management and leadership skills in student pharmacists, pharmacy residents and practitioners. For over 20 years, his scholarly activities have focused on building collaborations with health care organizations to implement clinical strategies delivered by pharmacists that improve health outcomes. This work is grounded in diffusion of innovation theory, principles of quality improvement, the discipline of implementation science.
