Measures to Assist Licensees and Education Providers During the COVID-19 Pandemic

The Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation announced several proactive measures to help professional licensees and education providers in light of the challenges confronting all Illinoisans during the COVID-19 and providers in light of the challenges contronting all Illinoisans during the COVID-19 and to further reduce contact between individuals, the Department has issued a series of variances that provide relief from the provisions of certain Administrative Rules pertaining to license renewal terms and to continuing education requirements. The five Variances may be found here. Any professional licenses issued by the Department that have renewal dates between March 1, 2020 through and including July 31, 2020 are granted an automatic extension to renew to September 30, 2020, Additionally, all current licensees under the Department's jurisdiction 2020. Additionally, all current licensees under the Department's jurisdiction whose license renewal deadlines fall within the period beginning March 1, 2020 through and including July 31, 2020 shall have up to, and including, September 30, 2020 to complete their continuing education





..... The Department wants to remind all authorized prescribers that there are currently no approved or recognized outpatient treatments or prophylactic regimes for COVID-19. Selfprescribing or prescribing to family or friends must be consistent with the standard of care and ethical standards of the relevant profession, including the existence of a provider-patient relationship; appropriate clinical indications for the medication, dosage, and amount prescribed; and maintenance of proper medical records.

Code 1330,500(f), a pharmacist may use their professional judgment, after screening for potential drug therapy problems, to determine whether to dispense a prescribed drug if there are National or State emergencies or guidelines affecting availability, usage or supplies of drugs; unavailability of a drug; or a potentially fraudulent prescription. Guidance For Pharmacies Regarding Delivery During COVID-19 Emergency Declaration

....Whereas, the Governor of the State of Illinois has issued Executive Order in Response to COVID-19 (Executive Order 2020-10) in which he ordered all individuals currently living in Illinois to stay at home or at their place of residence except as allowed in the Executive Order and to and to abide by social distancing requirements for the duration of the Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation; Therefore, the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation recommends that pharmacies offer delivery service to deliver the prescription drug order to a patient or patient's representative in a home or institution by an authorized agent of the pharmacy or by common carrier. A pharmacy must have the patient's consent before delivering a prescription drug order to the patient.

Guidance: Information for Healthcare Providers using Telehealth Services in Illinois

Providers using Telehealth Services in Illinois
On March 19, 2020, Governor Pritzker Issued Executive Order 2020-9 on
telehealth services (Executive Order to Expand Telehealth Services and
Protect Health Care Providers in Response to COVID-19). The Executive Order
recognized that "the CDC, taking note of a need to reduce unnecessary
healthcare visits and prevent transmission of respiratory viriuses at healthcare
facilities, currently recommends that healthcare providers increase the use
of telehealth systems, formal or otherwise, to access and care for patients to
decrease the volume of persons seeking care in facilities." The Executive
Order further noted the need to 'take measures to ensure the provision and
coverage of health care services while the public and health care providers
are subject to quarantine." The Department interprets Executive Order 20209 to permit an out-of-state health care provider not licensed in Illinois to
continue to provide health care services to an Illinois patient via telehealth
where there is a previously established provider/patient relationship. The
Department deems such a provider to be "authorized to practice in the State
of Illinois" pursuant to Section 5 of the Executive Order without further need
to obtain licensure in Illinois
